A Letter From The Pastor

"Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a certain village where a woman named Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at Jesus's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks, so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her, then, to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things, but few things are needed—indeed only one. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her." Luke 10:38-42

BUMC Family and Friends,

Jesus showed up at the home of Mary and Martha with his twelve disciples and who knows how many other followers. As the hosts, Mary and Martha had to feed them. So, Martha rolled up her sleeves and got to work, building the fire, cutting up ingredients, mixing dough and all the other myriad tasks required to prepare a meal for a large party. As Martha toiled away, Mary sat at the feet of Jesus and listened to him. She loved hearing Jesus talk and she took to heart all that he said about the Kingdom of God. Martha, overwhelmed by the huge task she had taken on, asked Jesus to tell Mary to help her. It was as much Mary's responsibility as it was hers, after all. But, Jesus would not. You can read Jesus' response in the closing lines above.

I am the kind of person who likes to "get things done," so I understand Martha. She was being responsible and doing the work that needed to be done to feed Jesus and his followers. It's difficult to fault her for that. Likewise, part of me wants to nudge Mary and ask her to go help out. It's her home, too. She is also a host. This is the conventional way of thinking in our society. There is work to do, so we get it done to the exclusion of all else.

Yet, in my heart I know that the lesson Jesus passed on is still the best answer. Mary had Jesus—God in the flesh—in her home and she wanted to learn from him. This was a rare opportunity and not to be taken lightly. Mary chose "the better part." She blew off her work to spend time with Jesus.


Save the Date
