Operation Christmas Child

In 2022, Operation Christmas Child delivered its 200 millionth shoe box. To commemorate this milestone, former shoebox recipient, Elizabeth Geoff went on a special journey to help pack the 200 millionth shoebox. At each stop on the national tour she added an item to the shoebox: a doll in Denver, Colorado; a flashlight in the United Kingdom; a reusable canvas bag by Canada; a plush koala toy by Australia/New Zealand; a jump rope by Germany; and a jump rope by Korea. Then she headed to Aurora, Illinois where she added a necklace. In Nashville, Tennessee, she packed colorful socks; continuing on to Punt Gorda, Florida she packed a water bottle filled with pretty hair ties. The tour ended in Charlotte, North Carolina at the procession center where Franklin Graham dedicated the shoebox and added a bright yellow yo-yo.

Finally, the symbolic shoebox was given by Elizabeth to eight year old Natalya in worn torn Ukraine. She clung to the flashlight saying that it would help her not be afraid during the air raids. This is just one story showing how these shoeboxes impact the children's lives.

Each month we are collecting a different item for the shoeboxes we will be filling later in the year to be sent to Operation Christmas Child. For May, let's collect clothing: t-shirts, shorts, small dresses, socks, flip-flops, etc. Remember we can't accept anything liquid. Small stuffed animals or small dolls are collected every month. Look for the box in the gathering area marked Operation Christmas Child (OCC).

They are non-profit and asked us to get the word out for those interested in joining to play golf at Cossett Creek Golf Course, Brunswick every week..


Rambling Roses


What Is Church?
